

## Reviewing 6<sup>th</sup> grade Spanish and looking ahead to 7<sup>th</sup> grade Spanish

**TIP:** *Work Smarter; Not Harder:* Reviewing vocab for a few minutes throughout the summer is more effective at committing vocab to long term memory than cramming several hours of studying into one day. Seeing it over and over again on multiple occasions tells your brain that it is important information to remember forever.

Using Spanish around the house in natural ways this summer will help you remember vocab. Perhaps your family will learn new things as well! Here are some other great ways to keep Spanish fresh in your mind this summer.

1. Quizlet is a great resource. All the quizlet sets in your folder (clase de 2021) are great to practice. To be successful in 7<sup>th</sup> grade Spanish you need to be familiar with these words.

12. creating and playing games in Spanish (card games for numbers; BINGO boards with pictures; Simon says; memory; picture; etc.)
13. writing stories in Spanish (\*\*without putting sentences into google translate) and sharing it with a Spanish speaker to read or emailing it to Ms. Fairbank
14. teaching someone the Spanish words that you know
